

Key terminology

- Affiliated Entity: (previously referred during EURAD-1 as Linked Third Parties) can perform action tasks in the EURAD-2 programme and are allowed to charge costs directly to the grant (they receive EC funding). Therefore, they are subject to financial checks, reviews and audits. Contrary to Beneficiaries, they do not need a national level Mandate.
- Associated Partners: (previously referred during EURAD-1 and PREDIS as *International Partners*) can perform action tasks in the EURAD-2 programme. They do it without receiving any EU funding. Therefore, they are not subject to financial checks, reviews or audits. They do not have any voting rights in the General Assembly.
- Beneficiaries: organisations mandated by their national programme owners or governmental Ministries
- **Colleges**: refers to platforms that gather a number of organisations depending on their role in radioactive waste management, i.e EURADSCIENCE (for RE), SITEX.Network (for TSO) and IGD-TP (for WMO)
- PMO (Programme Management Office): in charge of scientific and technical coordination of the programme, as well as day-to-day management and communication activities. Members are selected by the Coordinator.
- **WP Preparation Teams**: refers to a group of 3 persons (one per College) who were the main contacts for the development of the EURAD-2 workpackages




Figure 1 EURAD-2 Governance structure

Excellence – End-users and external collaboration

- Definition of 2 different groups
 - <u>End-users</u>: NDA required, able to provide feedback to the programme, review draft documents, have access to WP insights no power or approval rights. Defined as waste owners/generators, waste management organizations, regulators (other than participants in a WP).
 - <u>Stakeholders</u>: no NDA needed, invite to public events, main target audience for dissemination activities
- Involvement of key interest groups
 - Waste generators: via SNETP
 - Regulators: via TSO College (SITEX.Network), include engagement with ENSREG and OECD-NEA regulators forum
 - Civil Society: via TSO College (SITEX.Network)
 - International Associations: include engagement with IAEA and OECD-NEA







- Part of the budget is « held for future allocation» under Andra's budget
 - Re-distribution of budget for Task 2 (PMO overall scientific and technical coordination/ integration) and Task 3 (Bureau activities) will be done once the members of the PMO and the Bureau are known.

Budget – Knowledge Management WP -1/2

- For now distributed only among:
 - Amphos21 (Spain, RE) as WP Leader
 - Identified task leaders organisations and deputes
 - R&D WPs' Task 2 leader organisations (see next slide) allocated as KM Task 6, which will be reallocated within the WPs' technical partners as "on-demand" work
- Re-distribution of budget per KM Task will be done after evaluation of which organisations will contribute to which KM activity.
- Expected that 50% of the wave 1 budget of KM is "on-demand" allocations based on need and qualification (including Task 6 as mentioned above). All partners of the Consortium will be eligible to seek participation. Terms to be defined in the first months of the programme launch.



- Consortium Agreement
 - Andra is working on the Consortium Agreement
 - Signed only by Beneficiaries
 - Affiliated Entities will sign the declaration of honour to be added as Appendix
 - Aim to provide a first version by the end of 2023
- EC will evaluate the proposal in the next 5 months (until April 2024)
- Official start of EURAD-2: 1st October 2024, running for 5 years.
- 1st General Assembly and kick-off in-person meeting will be organised in October
 2024
 - Approval of the technical programme at the first General Assembly
 - Aiming allowing time for first WP discussion meetings

• What if we see something is wrong in the proposal (plan or budget)? What if we need to change something about our WP participation plan (effort, scope, persons of contact, including withdrawal from a task or a WP)?

Please send the information to the Coordinator email (<u>secretariat@ejp-eurad.eu</u>), and CC the relevant WP leader. Correction of errors and all other modifications will be done in an Amendment after the start of the partnership.

What if we need to change something about organization information?

Please send the information to the Coordinator email

When can we know if we got or are getting budget for KM?

See the proposal Excel budget submission. Other budget will be allocated after the start of the programme.

My organisation is not in the Consortium and wants to join the EURAD-2 consortium?

Interested parties can be in the End User Group or Stakeholder Group. They should join their respective Colleges to be kept informed of future (wave 2) funding preparations within EURAD-2.

• What if I know someone who wants to be an End User Group or Stakeholder Group member?

This information will be collected by the Coordinator at the start of the programme (autumn 2024).

• What if we know someone else internationally who is interested to be a potential Associated Partner?

Communicate this to the WP leader and keep Coordinator in CC. Such additions will be handled at the time of the Grant Agreement and/or first General Assembly in 2024.

• When do we need to have the legal document about our Affiliation declaration (for Affiliated Entities only)?

This is not known yet from the EC, but anticipated at the time of the Grant Agreement negotiation/signing before summer 2024. Clarifications will be provided by Coordinator in Spring.

When do we need to show our co-financing commitment?

This is not currently required. It is up to each organization to secure their own co-financing for the 50% direct cost coverage of R&D costs in certain WPs.

Can we start doing things for EURAD-2?

No, you won't be able to charge costs so please hold off until the official start in October 2024.

When do we start getting money?

The EC allocated pre-financing at the start of the programme.

• Where do I give feedback about the whole or part of the EURAD-2 preparation process?

Via your College leaders (slide 26), preferably by the end of 2023.

• I have not seen or received the final proposal (plan, budget), so where can I get it or download it?

Please ask your institute main contact for EURAD-2. If you don't know who that is, ask from the Coordinator. The file is not public to be downloaded from the EURAD/PREDIS web pages or ProjectPlace.

• Can I share the proposal (project plan and/or budget, Template #3) to others who are interested?

No, it is a confidential proposal, only to be shared among the members listed in the proposal (Beneficiaries, Associated Partners and Affiliated entities).

Can I share these slides?
