

### WP2 Knowledge Management

The last quarter has seen many of us busy with Knowledge Management (KM) activities within WP2 and right across the partnership, including completion of State-of-the-Art (SotA) reports and Green Papers capturing the current status of understanding in WP topic areas. Attention within the Strategic Studies is now shifting towards the production of White Papers. On this front, the KM Board has received a number of requests for clarification on the approach to be followed and we are addressing these in a brief **guidance note on White Paper production**, which will be circulated by mid-November. Please ensure authors read this before progressing White Paper drafting further to ensure consistency of approach, efficient quality control quality control and clear communication of key messages to our target audiences. A training webinar covering the points in this guidance will also be held in November – stay tuned for announcement of the date!

Other recent highlights include the range of **training and dissemination events** incorporating KM elements: panel sessions, breakout groups and workshops at the annual event in Bologna to name a few! The data management session of the EURAD-2 first annual event was a particular highlight, with the insights from Pablo Saiz of CERN / Zenodo being highly relevant.

The first EURAD-2 KM Workshop, titled "Strengthening KM in Radioactive Waste Management: Reflections on Practices, Integration and Building Synergies", was held on 12<sup>th</sup> September in Bologna, Italy, during the Annual Event. It brought together EURAD-2 partners, end-users, and stakeholders, along with KM specialists and representatives from the IAEA and OECD/NEA to exchange practical experiences and identify synergies. Keynote presentations addressed the prioritisation of critical knowledge domains, intergenerational knowledge transfer, and opportunities for collaboration in capacity building. Interactive group discussions reflected on lessons learned during the first year of EURAD-2, giving rise to constructive dialogue on encouraging participation, identifying subject matter experts, producing guidance, engaging mentors, delivering training activities and building a sustainable culture of KM.

### **WP11 CLIMATE**

The WP CLIMATE held its First Annual Meeting in September, after the first annual event. Over the course of the meeting, partners reviewed achievements from the first project year and outlined the roadmap for the year ahead. Discussions covered a broad range of topics, including climate modelling, systemic risk assessment, stakeholder engagement, and knowledge management.

### Collaboration Across Work Packages

Following the main sessions, participants from WP11 CLIMATE engaged in a joint workshop with colleagues from WP3 ASTRA, focusing on the potential impacts of climate change on alternative radioactive waste management strategies.

The interactive discussions explored issues such as:

- The role of deep borehole disposal in future waste management approaches,
- Public perception surrounding alternative strategies, and
- Methods to integrate climate-related uncertainties into decision-making for SIMS

This collaborative exchange provided valuable insights and laid the foundation for a joint process of continued cooperation in the coming months.



### WP13 OPTI


In the strategic study OPTI, significant milestones have been achieved in recent months. Two workshops were held, and a first deliverable was produced. The work package (WP) began with initial discussions aimed at developing a mutual understanding of optimization. In addition to the three colleges, representatives from civil society also participated in the exchange. The findings from these discussions were summarized in the draft of a Green Paper. The objectives of the Green Paper are to gather the perspectives of EURAD-2 actors, stimulate discussion on the necessity of optimization, identify the phases when optimization is needed, outline the (technical) challenges, and explore the most effective existing strategies for implementing optimization. OPTI aims to achieve a mutual understanding, and potentially a consensus, among the different actors regarding the interpretation of the term "optimization" in the context of a HLW/SF GDF. From the outset of the WP, it was anticipated that achieving this mutual understanding would require an iterative approach to preparing the deliverables.



The Green Paper was designated as a draft version. All WP partners were given the opportunity to review the draft. The discussion of the paper and the review results continued during a workshop. For this purpose, the WP team convened in Prague in early June. The workshop represented the latest achieved milestone. Pursuant to the review and the workshop discussions, the existing draft version of the Green Paper will undergo an update before publication. The delivery of a final, publicly available version of the Green Paper stands as a significant achievement for the WP OPTI during the summer months. Further actions will result in the identification of open issues and contribute to the development of new activities and work packages for the EURAD-2 2nd wave (10/2026-09/2029).

### WP15 DITOCO2030

DITOCO2030 work package partners remain dedicated to advancing innovative, safe and sustainable solutions for radioactive waste management. This commitment was reaffirmed earlier in September, when representatives from 24 organizations with 30 partners convened in Bologna for the Annual DITOCO2030 Meeting to further strengthen collaboration and drive progress toward safer and more sustainable management practices. This was also highlighted during the joint DITOCO2030 & HERMES technical session at the EURAD-2 First Annual Event.



Following the Annual Event, the WP had the opportunity to present at the Interdisciplinary Research Symposium on the Safety of Nuclear Disposal Practices (safeND 2025) conference in Berlin, which focused on best practices in nuclear waste disposal.

At the end of September, the WP successfully hosted our first Stakeholder Webinar "From Concept to Practice: Stakeholder/End-user Perspectives on Digital Twins for Radioactive Waste Facilities (DITOCO2030) ". This session offered a valuable forum to explore the practical applications of digital twins and to gather invaluable feedback and insights from our stakeholders. The vision remains clear: to add value to EURAD-2 by leveraging digital tools and emerging technologies, such as digital twins and AI, that are key to achieving safe and sustainable management practices. As Irina Gaus, EURAD-3 Chief Scientific Officer, aptly remarked, "Addressing the back-end properly prevents the front-end from sinking."

Looking ahead, we are thrilled to announce that DITOCO2030 results will be presented at the <u>DigiDECOM's NuclearNEXT 2025 - IFE</u>, and that the next stakeholder webinar is scheduled for December 2025.

The Work Package Board feels privileged to collaborate with such dedicated and talented colleagues within the DITOCO2030 community. Thank you all for your continued commitment and outstanding work, together, we are truly making a difference.



## EURAD-2 at the NEA IDKM Symposium in Japan

At the OECD/NEA Symposium on Information, Data and Knowledge Management (IDKM) held in Yokohama, Japan (7 – 10 October 2025), Alexandru Tatomir represented EURAD-2 in the high-level panel discussion on enhancing collaboration between IDKM specialists and radioactive waste management professionals, alongside experts from Japan, Korea and Ghana.

He also presented the EURAD-2 Knowledge Management programme during the plenary session on "Building a holistic vision for information, data and knowledge management". In addition, the EURAD-2 KM team contributed a poster highlighting the partnership's collective progress in strengthening KM practices.

These contributions helped increasing EURAD-2's visibility at the international level and highlighted how shared learning and collaboration strengthen the long-term safety of radioactive waste management.

## **Mentoring**

Launched in September, the EURAD-2 mentoring programme is underway. With the mentoring programme, we aim to match mentees and mentors that will collaborate to build knowledge and skills, collaborate. This will occur during a 12-month period (can be adjusted based on input of the mentor and mentee's needs). They can meet virtually (at least 1-2 hours per month), at their own pace. The main aim is mutual benefit for both parties, which should be reflected in the mentoring report that is produced at the end. An important note for mentors and mentees is that the mentoring programme is a voluntary commitment, so no financial support or payments are made by EURAD-2 towards the mentor-mentee pairs. That being said, the mobility programme can be used, if the use is justified.

## **Mobility Programme**

The EURAD-2 Mobility Programme, launched in January 2025 and, building on experiences from EURAD-1 and PREDIS, aims to financially support both junior and senior professionals to visit infrastructures from EURAD-2 partners and end-users, undertake internships, attend conferences and follow training courses in the field of radioactive waste management.

So far, 22 applications out of 32 eligible applications were approved, resulting in a mobility funding of about 39.000 Euros in the first year of EURAD-2.

The current call closes 31st October 2025 and the next application periods will run from December 1 - 31, 2025 and February 1 - 28, 2026.
